GOD'S LOVE

What I am about to tell you happened to me almost 18 years ago and I always believed in my heart that there is a special purpose for what transpired and that purpose has always been definite and solid in my mind--- to live to tell, simply to be a living witness to the goodness and mercy of our Lord and God. It took me this long because there was always a doubt in my mind that I should be the right person, worthy to bear this good news. For years I am working on my spiritual make-up, subconsciously waiting for that time when my heart is worthy to carry on this task. I was never convinced that if I re-tell it, I could give justice to what I actually experienced. How does one re-tell a miracle? How does one recapture overwhelming love and mercy in a few words? I still believe it is beyond words but with God's grace, I might be able to scratch the surface with this testimonial of God's love.

I was 21 years old when I first died. Some people call it a near-death experience but I actually believe I died because I was presented to Jesus for judgement. I saw Him, almost a silhouette but more real than that, a gloriously white vision. He was sitting on a very grand throne. Because I did not see his face, I also surmised that probably when people die and are not yet worthy to be accepted in heaven, they come face to face with Jesus but are not yet granted the privilege to see His face, because only the perfect soul can see Him.

As I said, this happened when I was 21 years old, graduating from university that school year. A group of my friends and I went to Bicol to take part in the Penafrancia Festival. That Sunday afternoon, we all decided to go swimming in a lake, about an hour drive away from where we were staying. To make a long story short, I drowned and lost consciousness. Later on, my friends told me that my heart actually stopped beating for several minutes, my face was a deathly blue pallor, and they have almost given me up for dead. The last conscious thought of this world that I had was trying to scream and gasping for breath while I was struggling in the water. Then everything faded......

The next thing I was aware of was floating in the air, feeling so tired, weak and heavy, as if I couldn't carry myself.



But I was not alone. I have an angel at my right side, holding me by the elbow and was lifting me up. I still felt very weak despite the angel's help and another angel appeared on my left side and helped lift me up. In my vision, we were all white, flowing, willowy figures suspended and rising up in the air.



Then came the next scene where I was in the threshold of heaven (at least that was how it seemed to me). The surroundings was very peaceful, pristine white, cloudy, as if a smoke machine was left on. But nobody was around, even my angels were gone, and then I saw Him. A few feet away, there was Jesus on His throne. I should mention that when all these happened, I was carrying a heavy burden of intense dislike for a person. And when I faced Jesus, for some reason, that sin was uppermost in my mind. The sinner that I was, I fell to my knees, crying incessantly from a mixture of guilt, fear of judgement, a sad acceptance that I will not be entering heaven, and from the realization that what I have become is not what I was meant to be. He never spoke, never said a reprimanding word but I was afraid of my judgement which I know was forthcoming. I wept. And when I spoke, I asked him for mercy, not for me but for my mother, who I know would be in despair when I died. I pleaded, for my mother's sake, "Please don't let me die yet, Lord, for my mother. In Tagalong, I said, "Kawawa naman ang mommy ko".

Maybe he saw how truly I love and care for my mother or maybe this act of unselfishness was my saving grace, because He gave me another chance at life. The next thing I know, I was in another place and high above me, was what seemed like the dome of a cathedral, flashing colourful scenes of my life, like a projector. One thing that amazed me was a scene I saw that happened to me when I was about 9 years old. I remember that afternoon very vividly. It was one of my greatest acts of kindness and charity to a stranger, a beggar, a poor lonely woman who was wandering the streets looking for her lost son. I gave this old woman some change, a glass of water, some cookies, a pair of slippers-- practically everything that I owned as a 9-year old. And there it was, beautifully haunting me in the after life. Unfortunately, there were also scenes that I was not happy to see---acts of selfishness, pride, petty dislikes, among others. Looking at all these, I cried again and made a decision to change my life if I had another chance to live again. >> page 10

YFC Holds First Youth Camp at St. Bernadette By Rosette Correa– YFC East

The Victoria Day long-weekend did not stop thirty-three youth from all over Surrey from joining Camp 6LORIFY, the sixth youth camp of the Youth for Christ Surrey II Chapter, at the St. Bernadette Parish Hall. Fr. Patrick Chisholm, parish priest of St. Bernadette, welcomed the youth and the YFC Surrey II Service Team composed of youth leaders from St. Matthew's Parish and St. Bernadette/Immaculate Conception

Parish for their three-day camp which started on May 21st and ended on May 23rd. The YFC is the youth ministry of the Couples for Christ family of ministries.

Taking Psalm 86:12 as their camp verse, the Camp 6LORIFY Service Team took the challenge of putting together a camp in such a short time, and a hectic schedule for the youth with examinations and end-of-the-year academic requirements looming ahead. For the youth leaders, it was an invitation from God to serve that they could not refuse, despite the obstacles and a YFC Regional Conference at the end of the month. Isaac Guevara, YFC Chapter Head for Surrey II, was overwhelmed with the amount of support for the camp. "The facilitators and the camp leaders really stepped up to make this camp possible. Even when I lost my voice the second night, the participants were sympathetic and remained enthusiastic and understood the importance of this spiritual journey for them." He also says that the support of the St. Bernadette Parish community and its CFC Chapter was also inspiring. Mikey Raymundo, parishioner and YFC Unit Head of St. Bernadette and IC Parish, had the same spiritual experience. "I am overwhelmed with the success of Camp 6LORIFY. I am excited at the same time to serve the St. Bernadette YFC as a Unit Head. For me it's not a chore - anything to do with serving God is what I love to do and I am looking forward to be doing this service for St. Bernadette." Both Guevara and Raymundo served as Youth Leaders for this camp for the first time.

The youth camp blends good fun through games and a talent show, but the main focus of the three-day retreat is prayer, reflection, confessions, Holy Mass and the five talks that elaborate on the role of youth in knowing, loving and serving God. "The YFC provides a link with young people to Christ's teaching and evangelical work," says Jim Diaz, the YFC Cluster Coordinator of Surrey. "While it is all done through a brotherhood through a variety of activities such as sports, retreats and other camps, the main focus of the ministry is to provide the youth a venue for worship and service. We expose them to the right environment for growth in our Christian faith." The YFC is open to youth ages twelve to twenty-two, and membership begins through the participation in youth camps, such as Camp 6LORIFY.

The youth camps are scheduled twice a year by YFC ministries in parishes all over the Lower Mainland where the CFC-YFC have their groups. The camps are run by senior members of the ministry, with CFC Parent Coordinators overseeing the logistics as well as the supervision of the participants and service teams 24/7. Talks are given by senior members as well as speakers from the parish and former YFC members who have gone to Singles for Christ and CFC, or such as in the case of Camp 6LORIFY speaker Steven Cheng, have gone into the seminary to study theology and become a priest.

Mike Potusek, YFC Unit Head and Youth Ministry Head of St. Matthew's Parish, acknowledges the success of camps like these to the youth leaders and the Parent Coordinators, who are CFC member couples. "The leaders and the PCs work really hard to make camps like these a reality. Without their help, dedication, prayers, and good example, we would not be here." Potusek adds that the CFC brings so many youth closer to God and he thanks them for being parents to their second family, the YFC.

The CFC Chapter of St. Bernadette appreciates the dedication and hard work of the YFC youth which especially shone during the camp. "Their spirituality is truly inspiring, and the couples of CFC are encouraged every day with the youth's energy and direction," says Danny Felices, Chapter Head of CFC St Bernadette/IC Chapter. "We pray that all the youth everywhere develop this dedication to God's service. Christ is truly glorified through these young people."

The YFC will hold the National Youth Conference in August which will be participated in by YFC members all over Canada and the US. With the same energy and enthusiasm, God's youth will continue to march onward in these events as His dedicated servants, doing His evangelical work to plant the seeds of His eternal word.




Then came the next scenario in a dark, narrow, and cave-like tunnel. In this setting, I immediately felt scared, fearful, a foreboding feeling was overwhelming me. I don't know how I knew it, but I know I am fighting for my life. I also know there was a train coming very fast and gaining up on me and I felt like I was being chased but was trapped in that tunnel. Somehow, I know that for me to be saved I have to scream before the train comes. I tried screaming but it felt like I was in a nightmare struggling to wake up, no voice was coming forth. I was literally battling something---I knew it was death. I was gasping for breath, growing more scared and panicky every second, re-living my struggle in the water when I was drowning. Then a woman's voice whispered in my ear, urging me to scream, telling me I can be saved if I scream. The voice coached me, encouraged me, strengthened me when I was weakening. And I grasped that voice, clung to it because I had nothing else to hold on to in the dark. That voice bought me time and strength. Right there and then, without any doubt, and I don't know how I knew it but I am certain that the woman's voice in the dark was Mother Mary's voice, taking part in my salvation. But time was not on my side, and I couldn't scream and I failed despite my best efforts to do so. I saw the train coming very fast, and I panicked and knew that was the end for me and there was acceptance of my judgement. I will die after all.....

And then the train was right in front of me and I felt the sensation of suddenly hurling down in a dark pit, as if the ground underneath me disappeared. And with a sinking feeling and acceptance of my fate, I know I was doomed. But in a split second, when I thought everything was lost, very unexpectedly, my outstretched hand was taken in a strong grasp, a man's gnarled hands. He held me so tight it hurt. I only saw his hands, very human, very strong hands. It was like looking at a movie scene where the whole screen was dominated by the picture of my hands taken in His. I was looking for the nail wounds but didn't get a chance to see them. But I know so surely in my heart that was my Lord, Jesus Christ, who, because He loved me so much with an outpouring of love and mercy, cannot let me go. Even at the most hopeless, end-of-the-tunnel situation, He will not give up on me. Until the end of my days, He wants me to be His. The Judge in my earlier vision became my Savior in my most desperate situation.

And all of a sudden, right after my realization that Jesus saved me, I was back in my friends' arms, screaming so loudly, screaming with all the strength left in my body, at the top of my lungs. And I was back in my physical body. Weak and yet strengthened. I asked these questions when I was revived.... Did I do something special in my life that I deserve a second chance? Am I destined to do something great for Him that's why I was saved? And later on, I remembered my judgement scene and for years I seemed afraid to ask, why did Jesus seem almost "stern"?

In answer, let me quote the following from an unknown author that I came across in my readings: "The bible tells us that God is love. In spite of his extensive knowledge of our sinfulness and unworthiness, he has declared, "I will never fail you. I will never forsake you" (Hebrews 13:5) One of the clearest demonstrations of his love is found at the cross on which Jesus died for us (Romans 5:8). God's love, however, is often misunderstood. Many think that because he loves us, he won't judge us. But his love for us does not negate the fact that he is also just. Scripture clearly and repeatedly makes the point that only the Godly will see his face. Therefore, we can be certain that our sins will be dealt with. For those who have accepted God's gift of salvation---Jesus's death on



the cross----their sins have been forgiven. For those who haven't accepted this gift, God's judgement is certain."

As to my first question, "what have I done that I am given a second chance with Him?"

The answer is NOTHING.... The bible says it is not because of our works but because of *HIS LOVE AND BY HIS GRACE* that He promised us a place with Him. When God breathed life on us, He has already planned for us to share in His kingdom. We have not done anything yet. When He gave us His only begotten Son, He is re-affirming that plan of salvation. It is up to us to do SOMETHING, to accept His gift of salvation, to work for our place with Him, to deserve and be worthy of that privilege. 

COMPLETING THE SEXUAL REVOLUTION Theology of the BODY

Many believe that human sexuality is a taboo topic in the church. Or at least something you only talk about in a whisper when a child asks embarrassing questions. Christopher West is here to tell you differently. The dynamic speaker and author has devoted his life to examining Pope John Paul II's 129 Wednesday audience messages, delivered from September 1979 to November 1984, dedicated to the theme of human sexuality in the light of Christ.

On October 2, 2010, Saturday, Couples for Christ is sponsoring "FREEDOM TO LOVE" Conference, Christopher West one-day seminar, 8 am-5 pm, on the late great Pope John Paul's "Theology of the Body" at St. Patrick Parish, 2881 Main St. Vancouver





West said that since 1993, he has been on a lifelong journey to explore the pope's work and bring the life-changing message of the church's true teaching to others.

"Lives are transformed. Marriages are transformed. Our own lives start making sense — we can understand why we made the choices we made, why we are in the pain that we are in. And we have hope for the future. Not for just our own future, but hope for the church and hope for the world."

West said that the Theology of the Body is the teaching of human sexuality and married love, but it is not just for married people. West invites everyone — young, old, married, single, priests, religious, consecrated celibates — to attend the seminar.

"It is a vision of why we are created male and female and why we hunger for love," he said. "It is an invitation to the banquet that really satisfies the hunger. It is for all of us."

"We are here to reflect on nothing short of the very meaning of our lives and the meaning of the Gospel," he said. West is married. He and his wife Wendy, who live in Pennsylvania, have five children.

Hungry for love

"We are hungry," West said. "God has put in each and every one of us a hunger for love. And when the banquet is not presented, we inevitably go to the culture's fast food menu. The culture offers us a promise of immediate gratification for our hungers. But you can only eat greasy chicken nuggets for so long before you start being sick."

West said that most people who grow up in the church were given the starvation diet, where desires are considered bad and must be repressed. Given the choice between starvation and greasy nuggets, he said, most people, himself included, would choose the nuggets.

"It is only when I discovered this Theology of the Body that I realized there was a banquet that really satisfies," he said. West said that the sexual revolution was responding to a legitimate hunger that was not being fed by the starvation diet. The Theology of the Body goes the distance — it completes the revolution.

"The revolution got us talking about our hunger, but it led us to the wrong food," he said. "This Theology of the Body acknowledges the hunger and leads us to the right food."

Who should attend the Theology of the Body seminar? West said, "If you are hungry, come."

"If you are looking for more than what the culture has to offer, come," he said. "If you thought Christianity was a list of oppressive rules, you will be delightfully surprised."

"Bring your friends, bring your neighbours, bring people that you would love to expose to the church's real teaching who have maybe left the church or feel ostracized," he said. "Bring your Protestant and Evangelical friends. The goal is to present this vision in a language where everyone can feel welcome."
