



True North Youth Ablaze at Youth for Christ

Fullness Youth from across Canada pray during the annual Youth for Christ national conference held this year at UBC. Over 400 young people from five different regions participated in the event. At the end of the three-day conference, Vancouver Archbishop J. Michael Miller CSB, celebrated a special Mass for those involved



The Student Union Building of the University of British Columbia was ablaze with God's presence as 400 youths from all over Canada gathered for Youth for Christ's national conference last August 6-8.

With youths representing the Atlantic region (Montreal), Capital region (Ontario), Big Sky region (Manitoba), Mountain region (Alberta) and Pacific region (B.C.), UBC was alive with singing, worship and praise.

Entitled "Alive!", the young people attended talks and competed in sports and creative pursuits, fostering friendships and fun as they gathered and gave their best to glorify God. Speakers at the conference were full-time or part-time missionary workers, as well as invited speakers from the archdiocese and Youth for Christ volunteers.

Talks such as "Blog of John" and "Weapon X: the Unused Weapon in Spiritual Warfare" were geared towards the young audience, who were enthused to hear more about their faith in their own language.

The keynote speech "Fullness in Christ" was given by Father Lucien Larre, who speaks in parish missions and neighboring provinces but who admitted that it was his first time to address Youth for Christ. He confessed that he liked to preach to young people because they have tremendous energy. "You can feel their energy which is necessary for Christ's work. They are the future of the Church, the future of Canada."

Father Larre said youth have dreams, ideals and are very optimistic. "This is what we need in the Church — those who dream, who have ideals and goals for the faith. The youth move toward achieving these goals: they have the energy to do that."

Robert Contreras and his wife, Rebecca, who are Couples for Christ members, brought the entire family to Vancouver from Winnipeg for the national conference. "It was a family trip for us," said Contreras, whose three children are also YFC members serving with them in their evangelical work.

Candy Subang, one of the speakers and a full-time mission worker from the Philippines, said that servanthood starts early in life, thus the Kids for Christ and YFC ministries of Couples for Christ are wonderful opportunities for families to serve and worship together.

"My father became a full-time mission worker in Mindanao when he lost his job at a steel company. I grew up seeing my parents work for the Lord, and I was inspired to do the same," she said. Michael Parillas, who came from Edmonton and is a mission volunteer with YFC, said this was his seventh conference. "I like coming to the conferences because I like sharing my faith with others. The excitement of being able to share my Catholic faith with my peers brings out the best in me. And knowing that this is all for God is the best thing about this service."

The three-day conference was capped by a Mass celebrated by Archbishop J. Michael Miller, who thanked the Couples for Christ and the Family Ministries for their dedication to evangelical work, and especially for their work with the youth.

A thanksgiving assembly followed the event at the Don Bosco Youth Center in Surrey the following Wednesday. Father Dave Sajak said he is always excited to see youth come to the center to celebrate their faith, and he and the Bosconian brothers appreciate the work that the YFC does for its ministry. "They truly keep the faith alive."

CFC MEETS JERUSALEM JONES


The Manila MCG teaching assembly last July 13 featured a charismatic speaker in the person of Steve K. Ray, a Baptist turned-Catholic who has made it his life mission to bring people back to the Catholic Church. Ray, who also goes by the nickname *Jerusalem Jones*, came with his wife of 33 years, Janet. In his talk, he shared about his difficult and sometimes painful journey from the Baptist tradition that he was raised in to the Catholic faith that he once considered extremely flawed. He talked about his life as a devout Baptist—memorizing Bible verses, studying the Scriptures, and teaching others about Jesus Christ and His gift of salvation. He took to heart what he was taught; that is, that Catholics have the wrong gospel and are going to hell, while Baptists are saved and going to heaven.

At 17, Ray gave his life to Jesus Christ and started devoting his time and energy to “saving” Catholics. He found no reason to convert to Catholicism, adding that the Catholics he knew then were “the biggest arguments against the Catholic Church.” Years later, however, his view changed when he and his wife saw problems in their own Protestant faith.

Ray said there were *three questions that started him and his wife off on their journey to Catholicism*. **First**, what is the essence of worship? The Protestants may have good preachers and vibrant music, but the one thing their churches lack is an altar of sacrifice. In his visits to the oldest churches in the world, Ray always noted the presence of such an altar, which in Protestant churches has been replaced with a podium. **Second**, who speaks for God today? Protestantism leaves the Scriptures open to varied personal interpretations, which have led to the mushrooming of many different denominations. **Third**, what does God expect of me, particularly concerning morals? Faced with so many moral issues, how does one choose which way to go?

Ray admits he almost became an agnostic in his quest for enlightenment. But after months of diligently poring over various books and references, he and his wife found the answers to their questions. First, the Catholic Church has kept the essence of worship; that is, the sacrifice we partake in during the Holy Eucharist. Second, the Catholic Church has a Pope who gives definitive teaching, thus preventing spiritual chaos. Third, the Catholic Church has unwaveringly stood its ground against the attacks on morality, insisting that God has laws that He expects us to obey.

“I read my way into the Catholic Church,” said Ray. “The more we learned, the more we were convinced that the Catholic Church was right. The Protestants are wrong.” Ray recounted how he sobbed when the realization that he was “Catholic” first hit him. He and his wife knew they would lose their family and friends once they converted to the Catholic



Church. As expected, his father was enraged when he found out about their plan. His teenage children refused to convert along with them. At that point, Ray decided to write his father a letter, which he asked his 16-year-old daughter to proofread.

The letter later became the basis for Ray’s book *Crossing the Tiber*. After reading the letter, his daughter told him she was joining the Catholic Church, too. Their family was formally received into the Roman Catholic Church on Pentecost Sunday in 1994. Ray recalled how he cried the entire time during the first mass he attended and through every mass for the next six years. Today he calls himself a missionary to those who do not know Jesus Christ, to those who are Christians but not Catholics, and to those who were born and raised as Catholics but have no clue. How lucky they are. The man who “came to the Catholic Church backwards” by arguing against it has vowed to never leave” and to “get people back into the fold.” He called on CFC to help turn the world upside-down for Christ. “Don’t just sit down and do nothing. Do something about it now.”

The open forum that followed was spirited. In reply to a question as to whether we Catholics should make the Sign of the Cross in front of non-Catholics or even non-Christians, Steve Ray countered that we Catholics should not compromise our faith and beliefs, we should always testify on who we are for

Jesus Christ, and we should be proud to announce our Catholic faith and demand that we be respected for it.

With regards to whether evangelization or conversion includes the acceptance of the teachings of the Catholic Church and the Sacraments, Steve said that when we accept Jesus, we should also accept what is important to Jesus -- His Bride, the Church and an integral part of His Church, the Sacraments. He also said that in doing works of mercy, we should always declare that we did the works of mercy as Catholics following Jesus' command to love. 



FREEDOM TO LOVE


Applying the Theology of the Body to Life and Relationships

“The world tells us that freedom is the ability to do what you want, whenever you want, with whomever you want. But has this led to strong relationships, strong families, or strong communities? In reality, since the days of the ‘sexual revolution’, the exact opposite has played out. Every day, we see rampant sexual chaos, exploitation, broken families, and a lot of pain – all as a result of an abuse and misunderstanding of ‘freedom’.”

“God wants us to experience the ‘Fullness of His Love’ in our Life, Marriage and Service”, was



how Norma Borja, CFC-Canada National Pro-Life Coordinator, envisioned it when, after two years of persistent prayers and follow ups, CFC was favored with an acceptance by the Theology of the Body Institute (TOBI) for Christopher West to conduct a “Freedom to Love” Conference in Vancouver, BC, last October 2, 2010. This is the annual Regional Pro-Life Conference conducted by CFC’s Pro-Life Ministry.

About 650 CFC members and parishioners from various parishes in the Archdiocese of Vancouver – couples, handmaids, singles, youth, priests, religious – packed St. Patrick Church at Main St., Vancouver, to listen to very lively, entertaining, deeply inspiring and invigorating talks by Christopher West, Catholic author and speaker, best known for his work on Pope John Paul II’s series of audience addresses entitled the Theology of the Body.

The whole day Freedom to Love Conference started at 8:00 a.m. with Holy Mass officiated by His Excellency, Archbishop Michael Miller, and concelebrated by Father Vincent Hawkswell, Parish Pastor of St. Patrick Parish. Archbishop Miller expressed his appreciation to CFC for organizing such an event in Vancouver.

Five very interesting topics vibrantly discussed by Christopher West were: Gods Eternal Plan of Love (a brief overview of the Theology of the Body); For Freedom Christ Has Set Us Free (Exploring What Freedom Is and Not); Love As I have Loved You (Exploring What Love Is and Not); Sexual Morality and the Freedom to Love (The “Why” Behind the “What” of Catholic Teaching); and Living the Freedom of Love (Journey of the Interior Life).

The Conference ended promptly at 4:00 p.m. with Closing Prayers led by Nick Borja, CFC-Canada National Director. Everyone who attended the Conference felt so privileged to meet and to listen to Christopher West, whose calendar of speaking engagements is fully booked for more than a year. All participants were all praises for Christopher West, were thankful to God and to CFC, and expressed hope to see and to listen to him again.

The same Freedom to Love Conference will be held in Toronto, Ontario, BC, on November 13, 2010, for CFC members in the East Coast of Canada and their families and friends.
