The Handmaids of the Lord (HOLD) recently held their 13th National Conference in Toronto, Ontario with the resounding echoes of "Call to Arms! Call to Victory!" throughout the weekend. The conference was attended by an estimated 600 delegates from all over Canada. Friday's event (Sept 16th) was started with the ceremonies opened by Malou Reyes, HOLD National Coordinator. It was a battle-ground with our Handmaids one with their battle chants crying out: WE'RE READY, WE'RE STEADY, TO MARCH WITH GOD ALMIGHTY! Delegates were represented on stage by performers from Calgary (Belt of



Truth), Victoria (Helmet of Salvation), Edmonton (Sword of the Spirit), Winnipeg (Breastplate of Righteousness), Toronto East 1 (Shield of Faith) and Ottawa (Sandals of Peace).

The 5 Conference sessions starting on Saturday were in themselves an emphatic call to take on the full armour of God. HOORAH! SFC CANADA GEARS UP FOR OPERATION TRUE NORTH

With over 300 delegates from all across Canada, and Bermuda, CFC Singles for Christ ushered in a new conference atop Whistler Mountain, in British Columbia, one of the world's prime vacation spots. Held on the last weekend of August (26-28), at the Whistler Convention Centre (inside Whistler Village), the event was promising to be a jam-packed weekend of worship, workshops, and wonder.

Themed in monochrome, modern military style, with a custom emblem based on Mary, Jesus and Canada, OP:TRU/TH (wordplay on Operation: True North) highlighted the truth of God's victory in the war between good and evil. Segment after segment built up on each other. Each pastoral session was a 'military' briefing, with session log videos introduced as chapters of one seamless story.

The conference itself was prepped from start to finish from area PreConferences, a series of teaser videos, and information fed via the cfcsfccanada.com website, Facebook and Twitter. Key focus points throughout the spring and summer seasons helped SFC Canada prepare well to receive the core messages relayed at conference.



With rosary prayers and Holy Mass, Friday began on a high. Fr. Dave Sadjak, a Salesian priest and the YFC & SFC Vancouver Spiritual Director, summarized the weekend in a reflection on the anchor passage of Ephesians 6:10-18. His homily helped shape the mindset of the delegates as they prepared their hearts for the weekend.

SFC Vancouver welcomed everyone with a flash mob opening number. John Acosta, SFC Fulltime Pastoral Worker and SFC National Coordinator opened the conference, and taught a simple army chant. After an exciting Olympic-style Praise Parade the prejudged competitions in Dance, Band, and Documentary Short Film coined "Soldier's Showcase", kept the crowd happy for hours. As well, an orientation session, aptly called the Commander's Address, was given by SFC Fulltime Pastoral Worker, Efren Baria.



Throughout his mini-talk, he taught the crowd to say "Hoorah", which means "Amen" in the military, every time the word "SFC" is spoken. And this would become a staple reaction during the weekend. In this mini-session, he simply outlined the flow of the weekend and the proper attitudes to take as a soldier for Christ. Before ending the night with closing prayers, pre-assigned discussion group leaders or squad leaders with designations like Alpha One, etc. met with their group members from different delegations for introductions and on their expectations for the weekend (squad initation).

A solemn time for adoration started off Saturday morning, segueing into Holy Mass, celebrated by Monsignor Jerry Desmond, parish priest of Our Lady of the Mountains in the Kamloops diocese, which encompasses Whistler Mountain. His reflection touched upon St. Monica, whose feast day it was, and her deep devotion to pray for St. Augustine. Prayer will always be the key to staying



faithful in the journey. After a few praise songs after mass, the session creative, video interviews about choices and decisions, introduced the first session. Briefing #1 entitled "The Worthy War" was presented by Ouel Gardon, CFC Family Ministries Coordinator for Canada. In gist, the session emphasized God as the one who fights the war, and that we simply follow His orders.

And since God is the mighty warrior, the winner, this war is worth fighting. He fought for us on the Cross, and so we fight for others so they can know, love, and serve Christ as well.

A sister from SFC Regina, Saskatchewan, gave a powerful testimony on how she had been fighting the different battles of her life, from losing a sister to dealing with her mother's cancer. Through it all she had a peace from the Lord, assured of His love. She is anchored in God's strength which is her joy. Again, there was ample time given for reflection and group discussion.

Briefing #2, "Stronghold", opened with a four-person spoken word piece showcasing the different issues most people deal with: pain from a break-up, father issues, a mother's neglect, and disappointment with God. This was to set-up the session's focus on weak spots which are the devil's gateway to ruining our lives. Fr. Dave Sadjak delivered strong points on Satan's subtleties, and on the not-so-obvious addictions we have, and how we can combat them. Once more, discussion groups met and prayed together, well into lunch.

Afterwards, three two-hour workshops ran simultaneously: Prayer, Spiritual Gifts, and Team Obstacle Course. The first two were conducted by Clayton Imoo, and Gerard Garcia, respectively. They are coordinators for the Office of the Youth & Young Adult Ministries for the Archdiocese of Vancouver. The last workshop was conducted outdoors, by Eric Cruz and Stephanie Cadiz (SFC Vancouver leaders),

utilizing nature and the beauty of Whistler. We were also graced with the presence of three sisters from the Theresian Carmelite Missionary Order. They each took a workshop as well, and offered their services for personal consultation to anyone who needed it.

To close the afternoon sessions, everyone gathered back to the main hall for the Soldiers Rally. This was a unique mix of sharings or conviction statements and a mini-Praisefest. YFC Fulltime Pastoral Worker Angelo Saludo, with his usual energy and enthusiasm exhorted the crowd to stand for Christ. Four sharers, four core values, four conviction statements: from addiction to erotica and masturbation to a healthy self-love and the quest for purity; from the chaos of a cheating father to the peace and reuniting of family; from personal poverty to utter generosity to the poor; from indifference and worldly comfort to a life lived fully for God. This was a very honest moment for many singles, hearing the voice of God speak so truthfully through their peers. After, the crowd dispersed to prepare for the evening's festivities.

The Heroes Gala was a night to recall the good works of our soldiers for Christ. It was held in honour of those who have been excellent, committed and courageous in loving God and neighbour in Christian service, namely the SFC Couple Coordinators. The evening began promptly with a sit-down dinner, then followed by a simple awards show,

Emmy-style, with emcees and presenters. Competition winners for Banner, T-Shirt Design, and Photo Essay were also given time for acceptance speeches. A video montage was played as a tribute to all coordinators of past and present, and then a simple toast of thanks for all gathered. The rest of the evening was filled with dancing and delight in one another's company.

Sunday was send-off day, beginning with rosary prayers and Holy Mass. Briefing #3, "Operation True North", was a session that challenged SFC to take on the full armour of God -to not wait for God to put it on us, but to take courage and step in faith. Efren Baria, who presented this last session, taught a new chant: "God is greater...All the time!" The mountain is great but greater work lies ahead, in the cities and valleys of the world. He then called on John Acosta to lead the closing festivities. John asked the National Core Team to come up on stage, and officially introduced them to SFC Canada. He then asked all squad leaders to receive specially prepared tokens for their group members. As they came up on stage, they were encouraged and embraced by each NCT member to keep fighting the good fight. They were then instructed to pray together, and then they broke off to pray with their respective cities/ areas. A rousing Praisefest followed, and the awards for Songwriting, Film, Band and Dance. As well, the host for 2012 conference was announced: in the nation's capital, Ottawa, Ontario.

As the conference winded down, there was a joy to leave the mountaintop and get to work. Many small areas, including Regina, Saskatchewan and some neighbouring cities in Alberta and British Columbia have sprung up in the last year, and were empowered tremendously by what happened in Whistler. Many members battled many hardships even during conference, the death of a parent, sickness in the family, and other distractions. Even in all this, SFC Canada was geared up, through the power of the Holy Spirit and the Blessed Virgin Mary's faithful intercession. The momentum is here, and the Lord will strike while it's hot. With emerging and new faces and ideas for a better young adult ministry, through solid formation and training, and increase in prayerfulness, every single man and woman will experience Christ in the truest sense of the word... PUT ON THE FULL ARMOR OF GOD EPHESIANS 6

As a saying goes, "Winning the battle does not necessarily mean winning the war." This may be true for earthly wars. Take for example the battle at Pearl Harbor. The Japanese won this battle big-time but eventually, they lost the war.



Do we give Him justice when we put Him on and present ourselves to the world? Or do we put on our armors half-heartedly and go into battle lukewarmly with misgivings and cold-feet? In my favorite war story, the Greek mythology's Trojan War, the war was won through cunning and art. Hopefully we do not let ourselves be like the Trojans who had all the most sophisticated artillery and defenses, but laid down their weapons because they were thrilled by a gift. It has been emphasized in all the talks and in the presentations that the

way of the enemy is cunning, devious, deceiving and always disguised in attractive packages --- pride, power, prestige, position, wealth, etc.

But also mentioned many times were the role of our Mother Mary and the importance of prayer in our daily lives. So let us use prayer and the intercession of our Holy Mother as powerful weapons in this fight.

As sure as our Lord Jesus Christ is already victorious, there is no reason to be fearful, discouraged and unsure. When we rely on God's strength and might, He gives us supernatural strength and boldness to fight our battles—the Holy Spirit. When we pray constantly especially in our moments of weakness and receive the sacraments often, we receive the graces we need to fight our battles. When we look up to Him in our moments of need, that's when we are blessed with what we need most, beyond earthly requirements. 

In a little while, I felt guilty about it. I should have worked hard to raise more funds for the charity. It is my time to pass the "leap of charity"





practice with prayers to keep them focused that all competitions and conferences would happen only because of Jesus Christ. Without His presence and His Spirit, the true meaning of sportsmanship and winning; and doing their best to win and having fun with other groups would become irrelevant." Elvis also teaches the team the virtue of humility and positive attitude on hardwork, teamwork and fair play.

What then could be the third factor to winning consistently? When the championship trophy is brought home, parents get excited the most. And why not? Next to parent coordinators who know all the YFC's activities, the biological parents receive half of the job's accomplishment. The moms or dads drive their children to every activity they attend to or if the children are of legal age to drive their own car, parents worry when they have not come home on time. It's natural to expect, but having CFC or non-CFC parents who trust the parent-coordinators what teachings are imparted to their children once they endorse them to become YFC members, the competition is 100% won. These parents know what could encourage their children to stay, grow and serve in a community.

Cris and Cecile Saguindan, CFC household leaders and parents of YFC members Chris, Macy and Mawey, believe their initial task as pastors of their children is instilling on their young minds that service to the Lord is part of a Catholic's life. Once connected to the church receiving spiritual nourishment, their children can easily adapt to the activities that a faith-based ministry like Youth for Christ could give their children.

Cecile confirms Chris, Macy and Mawey have started joining and involving themselves in every YFC activities before RY-CON. While their children are enjoying the sports activity and fellowship with other youths, Cris and Cecile strongly believe the three have to outgrow these activities and attending the CFC-YFC Western Canada Conference is one good food to satisfy their young spiritual hunger.

If sending a YFC member Jissell to the conference brought a financial issue to her parents Celso and Joan Galvez, also CFC leaders; registering three children meant a huge budget to Cris and Cecile which they all admitted got under the way.

Celso and Joan opened up Jissell's need to their household and a couple offered to pay for Jissell's conference fee while her bus fare was raised up through supporting YFC's fundraising activity spearheaded by Gustav and Melanie which paid majority of the 28 participants' registration fees. Meanwhile, funds solicited from Cris' and Cecile's **generous friends and CFC brothers and sisters** supported their three children to attend the conference. They now are up to saving for the Youth Camp in October.

"So much is expected from us young people. I am learning to use the armors right now. I believe this is the right time to start breaking down the walls in us." - *Jissell*

"I was able to relate to most of the talks. I have gone to several conferences already and each conference is unique in itself." – *Victoria*

"I attended both the 2010 and 2011 conferences and I don't know why I could see any difference at all. I don't know. What I think I saw few participants from our city because not all can afford to go to Edmonton." *Maris*

"It's a new experience to me. More competitions were presented and many winners, at that. The Holy Spirit is ever present in every session of the praisefest. One proof was a 'tita' (parent coordinator) fainted because she was spiritually overwhelmed." - *Charina*

James Lucero, conference leader worship and sharer, believes that attending a conference has *blessings*. He attended Western Canada conferences thrice already and he would always count on the blessings he received from each one. An unexpected blessing was the honour he was one among the conference worship leaders. It's also a blessing meeting new friends from Edmonton and Calgary, he says.

Like the rest of growing adults in YFC, James, Vicky and Mitchell have collective memories to learn from and pass on to the next YFC group who could call themselves consistent winners. They are open to what they've been and gone through and are of age to leave the YFC group and move on to the next program. But while in transition, they maximize the time serving their YFC brothers and sisters and getting in touch through sports activities, general assemblies and conferences. They will always have the desire to come back and serve because **they are Youths for Christ – each of them belongs to Christ and for Christ.** They have accomplished a job well done – **spreading the love of Jesus Christ.**
